4. First-aid measures

6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures	Use a NIOSH/MSHA approved respirator if there is a risk of exposure to dust/fume at levels exceeding the exposure limits. Wear appropriate protective equipment and clothing during clean-up. Many gases are heavier than air and will spread along ground and collect in low or confined areas (sewers, basements, tanks).
